**James Hollis, Ph.D.**, was born in Springfield, Illinois, and graduated from Manchester University in 1962 and Drew University in 1967. He taught Humanities 26 years in various colleges and universities before retraining as a Jungian analyst at the C.G. Jung Institute of Zurich, Switzerland (1977-82). He is presently a licensed Jungian analyst in private practice in Washington, D.C. He served as Executive Director of the Jung Educational Center in Houston, Texas for many years, and he was Executive Director of the Jung Society of Washington until 2019, and now serves on the JSW Board of Directors. He is a retired Senior Training Analyst for the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts, was first Director of Training of the Philadelphia Jung Institute, and is Vice-

President Emeritus of the Philemon Foundation. Additionally he is a Professor of Jungian Studies for Saybrook University of San Francisco/Houston.



**Stefano Carpani, M.A., M.Phil.** is an Italian sociologist (Cambridge and Manchester) and psychoanalyst trained at the C.G. Jung Institute, Zürich and a Ph.D. candidate in the Department of Psychosocial and Psychoanalytical Studies from University of Essex. He graduated in Literature and Philosophy from the Catholic University of Milan. He presently works in private practice in Berlin. He is the initiator of the YouTube interview series *Breakfast at Küsnacht*, which aims to capture the voices of senior Jungians, and he is also one of the initiators of *Psychosocial Wednesdays*, a digital salon moulded on Freud's Wednesday meetings in Vienna and on Jung's meetings at the Psychological Club.
